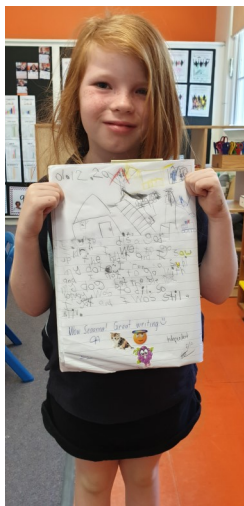
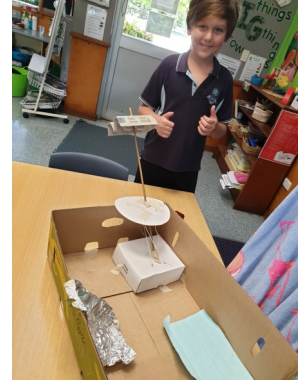

3 freezer hacks for the holiday season!

With the festive season fast approaching, it's a good time to think about how to store your food right to avoid wasting food.

Here are 3 freezer hacks to help your food last longer this summer:

- ⇒ If you have leftover BBQ's or roasts, freeze them to use for a meal another time. Just defrost in the fridge for 1-2 days before you want to use it.
- ⇒ Chop up leftover herbs and put them in ice cube trays topped up with water. You can add herb ice cubes to meals while cooking for a hit of flavour, or pop them in a refreshing summer drink!
- ⇒ Store bread in the freezer. Sure, we all know this one, but remembering to do it is another thing! In this hot and humid weather, bread doesn't last long, so get it in the freezer before you forget.

And if you do have any food waste or scraps that can't be eaten, remember to put it in the food and organics bin (that's the one with the green lid). It will be turned into compost to help our local farmers supply food for our region.

Healthy no-bake fruit roll-ups

- 500g fruit-eg Strawberries
- Sugar (optional to taste)
- Olive oil

Method 1

Hull strawberries.

Method 2

Place fruit in a blender until it forms a smooth puree.

Method 3

Place fruit in a small saucepan and simmer on low so the mixture thickens slightly - approximately five to 10 minutes. Stir occasionally.

Method 4

Sparingly grease the back of a metal baking tin or tray with olive oil, just enough for it to thinly coat the surface

Method 5

Pour fruit mixture onto the tray and form a thin layer, smoothing over any holes.

Method 6

Put the tray in a sunny spot and leave for a minimum of six to eight hours, or until it feels firm to the touch and does not stick to your finger.

Method 7

When it's completely dry, use a very thin spatula or BBQ scraper to peel the edges up and slowly use your hands to roll it up on the tray. The olive should prevent it from sticking at all.

Method 8

Slice and keep in an airtight container in the fridge. The lifespan will depend on the fruit and sugar used but should last a minimum of three to four days.
